

Bible Study, Symbols Of The Holy Spirit, Week 6, Fire

Day: 1

Read Matthew 3: 1-12(Text verse 11)

1. What did John baptize the people with?
2. How does Jesus baptize us?
3. Here the fire as not the same as in verse 10, here it stands for the revelation of the Holy Spirit that is seen with power, force and miracles.
4. Read Acts 2: 1-4. What do you think is the symbol of the fire on the disciples here?
5. Did it give them an internal “fire” that set other “to light?”
6. Do you think that we should be on “fire” for God?
7. In today’s life being “on fire” for God is a very important sign of the Holy Spirit in our lives
8. Do you have it?
9. Read Hebrews 12: 29 and Exodus 3: 1-6

Day: 2

Read Isaiah 4: 1-6 (Text verse 40)

“Isaiah 4:4 (The Message) GOD will give Zion's women a good bath. He'll scrub the bloodstained city of its violence and brutality, purge the place with a firestorm of judgment.”

1. With what does God purge His people according to this piece?
2. How will we be cleansed of all our sins and wrong doings?
3. What is the characteristic of fire?
4. How can we see that as a symbol of the Holy Spirit working in us?
5. What is there in your life that needs to be “burnt away?”
6. Read Proverbs 17: 3 and 1 Peter 1: 3-9

Day: 3 (Sins of the mouth)

Read Isaiah 6: 1-13 (Text verse 5)

1. Can fire be used to purify?
2. Where do we see an example of it in everyday life?
3. What is Isaiah’s problem in verse 5?
4. How does God cleanse his lips?
5. Does that symbolize God’s mercy and forgiveness?
6. Read Mark 14: 31 and Matthew 26: 72.
7. Do you think that there also comes words of treason and broken promises from our mouths, and very often?
8. Try and think of all the ways our mouths and tongues are used to sin and blaspheme these days?

9. Do you think that we also need the Holy Spirit to touch our lips with a hot coal?
10. How do you use your mouth to sin and hurt God and His kingdom?
11. Read Psalm 141:3 and James 3: 1-2 and Proverbs 18: 21
12. Think about our life and the words we use.

Day: 4

Read Psalm 68: 1-14 (Text verse 2)

1. Today we see that fire can also melt. It can melt wax and make it soft. Do you think it can make the hearts of hard people soft?
2. During the revival in Wales (when the fire came) hard hearts became soft for God.
3. A hard man that walked by a meeting, changed his life when he heard a little girl read John 3: 16. Do you think this can happen again?
4. What do you have to do, in your life, to make it happen?
5. For whom do you specifically have to pray concerning this?
6. Read Acts 26: 9-26 and 1 Timothy 1:12-14

Day: 5

Read Leviticus 6: 1-13 (Text verse 12)

1. What did people in those times use fire for, apart from the fire on the alter?
2. Should we have the fire of the Holy Spirit in us to keep us warm?
3. How can we prevent the fire from the Holy Spirit from “going out?”
“1Thessalonians 5:19 Quench not the Spirit.”
4. Is it possible to do what we have to without the help of The Holy Spirit the “fire?” Read Revelations 2: 1-7.
5. Is the Holy Spirit still burning in you today?
6. If not, invite Him back in, God wants to be with you all the time, not only to start the “fire” in your life and then disappear again. He wants to keep you burning all day, everyday!

Day: 6

Read Isaiah 43: 16-21 (Text verse 21)

1. If it is in water’s nature to always fall, what is the nature of fire?
2. Do you think the “fire” of the Holy Spirit inspires us to a life of prayer and praise?
3. Do you think the “fire” of the Holy Spirit deposits the principle of a life of going “upwards?”
4. What happens to us as the “Fire” burns in us more and more?
5. Do you think we will live a life of worship and praise if we have the “fire” of the Holy Spirit in us?
6. Is the “flame” of thankfulness and praise burning in you?
7. Read Revelations 8: 1-4

Day: 7

Read Daniel 3: 8-30 Text verses 25 & 28)

1. What did God do when He wanted Moses' attention?
2. He is present through the Holy Spirit and tells Moses that the ground is holy ground.
3. Do you think we can live a victorious life without the Holy Spirit?
4. If we have the Holy Spirit and live in victory, do we need the Holy Spirit to be poured out on us again or has the Holy Spirit been poured out completely already?
5. Do you think the Holy Spirit should get more of us?
6. Do you think if we live in obedience we will have the experience, like Daniel's friends, that we can stay true even in the "fire" of life through the "fire" of the Holy Spirit?
7. What did Daniel's friend find in the fire?
8. What is the result of this in the life of a believer?
9. Can you live victoriously like that?
10. Do you have the "fire" of the Holy Spirit in you?
11. What did this weeks study mean to you?
12. What should you do in response to it?
