

Bible Study, Titus, Week 7

Day: 1

Read Titus 3: 3-7

1. Read the whole piece for the week to get an overview.
2. Paul once again speaks about the gospel, to him it is all important! He cannot help but to speak about it all the time. This time he shows it in a different light. He starts by saying what the lives of unsaved people look like. He names nine things, what are they?
3. Give a practical example for each.

Day: 2

Read Titus 3: 3

Yesterday we mentioned nine things. We can say they are symptoms of a condition in every person's life or at least it appears in every person's life.

1. What is the name you will give this "Condition?"
2. When did man become like that?
3. And You?

Day: 3

Read Titus 3: 4

1. If we look at yesterday, we can say fortunately things can be changed.
2. Who is Paul referring to when he says: "God our Savior?"
3. What do the words "kindness and love" refer to?
4. When did it appear?

Day: 4

Read Titus 3: 5

Because of the false prophets (Titus 1: 10-16) Paul makes very sure that Titus knows who saved man.

1. Explain what "saved" and "righteousness" means.
2. Decide whose work, according to this verse, it is not.
3. Decide whose work it is.
4. What does that mean to you personally?

Day: 5

Read Titus 3: 5

Paul says Christ saves us by us being reborn. To understand it, read Romans 6: 4-6. Paul likens man's salvation with Christ's death and resurrections. Your sinful nature has to die and the "new" you has to start living.

1. What does the words "being reborn" mean to you about the kind of life Christ gives us?
2. What does the word "newness" mean to you as far as the life Christ gives?

Day: 6

Read Titus 3: 5-7

1. Here the Holy Spirit is mentioned for the first time. What do these verses say about the way we received the Holy Spirit?
2. What do these verses say about the kind of work the Holy Spirit came to do?
3. Paul says we are inheritors of everlasting life. What are the rights of an heir?
4. What are the responsibilities of an heir?
5. What does that mean for our spiritual life?

Day: 7

Read Titus 3: 3-7

Jesus says in John 6: 47 "Truly, truly, I say to you, He who believes on Me has everlasting life" and now Paul says in Titus 3: 7 "that being justified by His grace, we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life"

1. How do you explain or reconcile these two with each other?
2. What is the message in it?
3. How do you have to answer to these messages?
4. What kind of attitude and works does God expect from you?
5. How are you going to implement this weeks Bible Study in your life?
